Did you know that the month of August is National Eye Exam Month? This designation was directed by Sears Optical in 1989. The importance of proper eye health is crucial and frequently people put it in on their, "I'll do it tomorrow list." When I was 6 years old, grandma, mother and I went to Target to get ready to buy school clothes for the new school year. I was so

excited thinking about all the things I would learn and wondered if I could get a toy. On the drive I looked out my window in the middle of suburban North Dallas and declared, "Grandma, look, Dairy Cows!"

I was so excited to see dairy cows. Earlier that spring, I milked one at the local fair. My grandma looked sideways and said, "Myra, you've got to make him an appointment to get glasses!" As we drove closer and closer the black and white dairy cows melted away and became black and white trash bags piled up on the lawn of a business. This story reminds me of how we see things as Christians.

We see things in black and white. We know how they are supposed to be. But when we truly see the Holy Spirit at work our eyes are opened. The Apostle Paul had a similar thing happen to him. Paul, once named Saul, was a zealous Pharisee who followed the Laws of Moses explicitly. He knew that God was one God and that the followers of Jesus of Nazareth were threatening all that he and the pharisees held dear. They had over 600 years of tradition and Talmudic study to give them the perception that Christians were destroying the Jewish faith, and once more leading people astray. Paul was instrumental in the stoning of the First Martyr Stephen. Stephen saw the Christ in the clouds...I wonder what kept Saul from seeing the Christ?

On the road to Damascus, Saul encountered the risen Christ. The brilliance of that moment caused him to go blind. It wasn't until Ananias came and proclaimed that he was sent to restore sight and to be filled with the Holy Spirit that he would see again. Paul's healing was not just a fitting for a new pair of glasses, but a spiritual healing that would correct his spiritual vision and see his new calling. *(Continued on Page 3)*

Paul's conversion would lead him to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to the gentile nations. In Galatians 3:25-30 Paul writes,

²⁵ But once a person has learned to have faith, there is no more need to have the Law as a teacher. ²⁶ All of you are God's children because of your faith in Christ Jesus. ²⁷ And when you were baptized, it was as though you had put on Christ in the same way you put on new clothes. ²⁸ Faith in Christ Jesus is what makes each of you equal with each other, whether you are a Jew or a Greek, a slave or a free person, a man or a woman. ²⁹ So if you belong to Christ, you are now part of Abraham's family, ^[a] and you will be given what God has promised.

We as Christians sometimes fall into the same traps as Paul did. We see things in black and white and assume we know what we are seeing. I know I did the day I saw those beautiful black Holsteins on the lawn of the local business in the suburbs of North Dallas! We need to encounter the light of Christ to open our eyes to the love and mystery that we all belong to the family of God. When our spiritual eyes are open, we will find a world of beauty and color; a world that is transfigured with the renewing of minds through the love and guidance of the Holy Spirit. My prayer is that we see through eyes of love and compassion and see the holiness of all God's children whether they are Jew or Greek, slave or free, man or woman.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT that The United Church Homes is compassionate to LGBTQ Seniors?

-Because I'm getting OLDER!! For years I used to say that AARP junk mail had the wrong address, but as I reach the senior category, I can no longer deny it. My mother is 92 so I probably have some longevity in my genes. Forty years ago, my gay friends and I would talk about what we will do when we get old, where will we go, will we be allowed to be with our partners? Will we be understood? Will we be disrespected? Will we be abused if anyone finds out we're gay? These fears were real back then. Hearing about The United Church Homes, their Open and Affirming status, the special SAGE training, compassionate treatment, care and respect for LGBTQ seniors, quiets that fear. I'm looking forward to hearing Rev Beth Long-Higgins speak at our church.

UCH Furthers Commitment to LGBT Older Adults In 2017

United Church Homes obtained the platinum level in SAGE Care training, cultural competency training for those working with LGBT older adults. More than 80 percent of staff participated across the entire UCH network. UCH was recertified at the platinum level this year. The move came five years after the United Church Homes Board of Directors voted to become Open and Affirming, a designation within the United Church of Christ that empowers groups to fully accept — not just tolerate — LGBT people to live their most authentic lives.
